Challenges

- The intensity of need of special education students has been increasing (especially in behavior)—this is evident in both increased associate needs and changes in student level over time

- Use of program Associates to mitigate lost instruction due to behaviors
- Use of subs to allow teachers to focus on behaviors while new behavior plans take effect

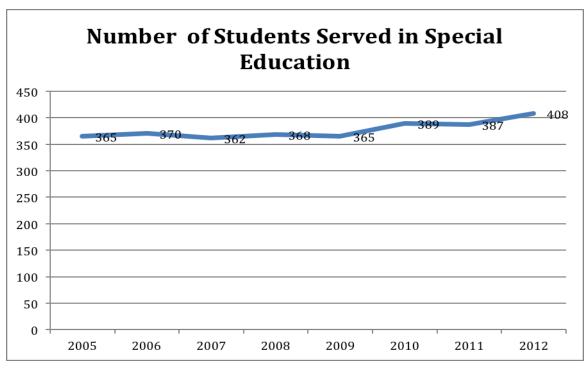

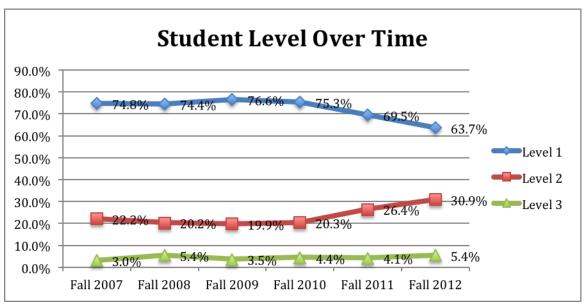
- Development of program outcome measures
