Rotary Club Nearly Triples Donations For Winter Coat Drive Supporting Urbandale Students
Building on the momentum of a successful 2014 winter coat drive, Rotary Club of Northwest Des
Moines distributes almost three times as many coats this year to help Urbandale students in need

URBANDALE, lowa – November 12, 2015 – Driven by a collective passion and purpose that places service above self, the <u>Rotary Club of Northwest Des Moines</u> proudly announces the distribution of 337 winter coats to help keep <u>Urbandale Community School District</u> (UCSD) students in need warm this winter. While last year's winter coat drive was a success with 133 coats being distributed, the substantial increase in winter coats being distributed this year will have an even greater and more far-reaching impact in the lives of UCSD students. Rotary members donated funds to purchase the winter coats and collaborated with UCSD Facilitators of Family Outreach (FFO) to determine the gender and sizes needed to help support students in elementary, middle and high school.

The generous donations by the Rotary Club of Northwest Des Moines were part of a larger vision of the Rotary District 6000. Each Rotary Club within District 6000 raised money to supply coats to students within their own communities. In total, Rotary District 6000 raised enough money to purchase and donate 9,176 winter coats for students in need throughout Iowa.

The UCSD provides a multitude of services and programs designed to better support the needs of students. In 2009, UHS students with intellectual disabilities and the <u>Urbandale Chapter of Best Buddies</u> brought to life a district-wide program called <u>The Clothing Closet</u>. The Clothing Closet is a student-run, non-profit business that accepts clothing donations in order to provide clothing free of charge to those in need. With the help of teachers and associates, students manage The Clothing Closet by accepting donations, laundering clothing received, responding to order requests, managing inventory and interacting with customers. The Clothing Closet has been so successful that it has outgrown its space at the high school and has expanded to a satellite location next door to <u>The Urbandale Food Pantry</u>.
