What is PBIS?:

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) is a system that we have begun to learn about and utilize at Valerius to foster a safe and effective learning environment. This system helps to reduce instructional disruptions and promotes a positive school

environment. At Valerius, our PBIS focus is on respect, responsibility, and safety. PBIS is a research-based program that has been proven to improve academic success, reduce problem behaviors, and contribute to overall school safety.

This year, staff members have begun learning about PBIS structures to help them engage all learners during instruction and provide positive, timely feedback. A couple of the fun ways we are providing students positive feedback is through S.O.A.R. (which stands for Student of Ambition Referral) recognition. Students are recognized for being respectful, responsible, and safe. Parents will be contacted when their student has received a S.O.A.R. to share in the celebration. Students will be recognized during announcements, have a positive office visit, and get to take their S.O.A.R. document home to show off. Second, we have begun recognizing Students of the Week. Students of the week are selected for demonstrating respectful, responsible, and safe choices consistently throughout the week. They will be recognized each Friday, get their pictures taken, get a personalized certificate, and wear the traveling trophy for the week. Overall, we feel that designing a positive school-wide system for student success ensures that we are providing appropriate supports that meet the needs of each individual student.

We have also initiated a team focused on hope, well-being, and engagement of our students. The Eagle Leaders committee is comprised of teacher representatives, counselor, associates, parents, and administrator that meet to develop strategies that meet the unique needs of Valerius students. Our goal for the upcoming school year will focus on strengthening our school-wide PBIS system. We have an excellent staff at Valerius and we will continue to act on the shared belief that together, we can make a difference in the academic performance and social emotional well being of all our students.

News from the Health Office

It is cold and flu season, so please remind your students about good hand washing. Washing hands is the best way to prevent the spread of illness! If your child is ill with a fever (temp above 101° F), vomiting or diarrhea in the past 24 hours, they will need to stay home from school. Students may return to school once they are symptom free for at least 24 hours. Also, please keep in mind that the weather is very unpredictable this time of year. Make sure to dress the your student in layers and bring a coat. Morning recesses can still be very cold!

Counselor's Corner

In the last Counselor's Corner, I gave parents and guardians a few suggestions about ways to praise their children. According to Mary Cay Ricci, author of Mindsets in the Classroom research suggests that parents should think twice about praising their kids for being "smart" or "talented," because this may foster a "fixed mindset". Instead, if we encourage our kids' efforts and acknowledge their persistence and hard work, then we will support their development of a "growth mindset". Children with a growth mindset believe that with effort and persistence they can learn and achieve more in school. A growth mindset will better equip students to persevere and pick themselves up when things do not go their way. Parents, take a minute to examine your own belief systems. Do you have a growth mindset? Do you believe that with effort, persistence, and motivation your children can achieve their goals?

Dr. Carol Dweck, an educational researcher states,

"Parents should not shield their children from challenges, mistakes, and struggles. Instead, parents should teach children to love challenges. They can say things like "This is hard. What fun!" or "This is too easy. It's no fun." They should teach their children to

embrace mistakes by saying things like, "Oooh, here's an interesting mistake. What should we do next?" And they should teach children to love effort: "That was a fantastic struggle. You really stuck to it and made great progress!" or "This will take a lot of effort--boy, will it be fun!"

Some parents need to work at having a growth mindset. It takes time and practice, but it is well worth it when you see the difference that it makes in your children! Stay tuned next month for more ideas about ways to foster a growth mindset in your family!
