Parents,

It is a priority for staff at Valerius to provide a safe learning environment for our students. Here are some of the things we do to ensure our emergency-preparedness plans are reliably in place so we are ready to spring into action when needed:

- 1. Collaboration with Urbandale Police Department: Starting after spring break, law enforcement has been stopping by each Urbandale school on a daily basis. An officer might stop by the office to see how things are going or they may take a quick walk around the school. It shouldn't take long for our students, staff and families to get used to this practice. The kids love to see our UPD officers!
- 2. Drill Practice: We complete 100% of the state-required drills for fire and tornado. Last week, we practiced our tornado safety plan during the state-wide tornado drill. We have a process to ensure that every single student in our school is accounted for in less than two minutes after we move to drill locations throughout the building/grounds.
- 3. Staff Emergency training: Each year, we take time as a staff to review our plan for responding to emergencies. Our emergency response plan has been reviewed by the Urbandale Police Department and by our Director of Building and Grounds. It is also submitted to and reviewed by the superintendent's office each year.

Although the definition of emergency is defined as an unforeseen combination of circumstances that calls for immediate action, we prioritize having effective safety processes in place to manage these unexpected circumstances. We will always put safety of our students at the top of our list of priorities. If you have questions, please stop in, give me a call or shoot me an email!

MESSAGE FROM MRS. MACGREGOR

Hi Valerius Families,

Happy Spring! All grades have been working on our Ethical Behavior unit this past month in guidance. We have been talking about how to tell the difference between mean behavior and bullying. There are four characteristics that we are looking for when we are identifying bullying:

1. Behavior that is done on purpose

2. Behavior that is hurtful in some way (hurts you physically, hurts your feelings, or damages your property)

- 3. Often the behavior is repeated
- 4. There is a power imbalance (the bully has power over you in some way: you might be scared to come to school or ride the bus, you might try to avoid recess or get stomachaches)

This is a tricky process for kids to understand because every case is different and the definition can waiver, too. (For example, threatening someone with a knife is never okay. It does not need to be repeated to be considered bullying.) Often when someone is being mean to a student they automatically jump to "She's bullying me!" We try to have students think about the four characteristics and usually they discover that it's not actually bullying, but rather a mean moment.

We also emphasize how you can use strategies to deflect a bully like avoid or ignore the bully, stay with friends, stand up for yourself in a confident way or tell an adult right away.

Please let us know if you feel your student is involved in a bullying situation. We want to help all Valerius students feel safe at school.

MESSAGE FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

When to Stay Home:

Fever- Student must be fever free for 24 hours (less than 101 degrees) without a fever reducer medication. **Vomit**- Student must have not vomited for 24 hours before returning to school.

Diarrhea- Student must be free from diarrhea for 24 hours.

Pink Eye- Student can return to school after 1st dose of medication or as directed by your physician. **Lice**- Student is not sent home the day of discovery. Allowed to return after initial treatment.

Spring Weather: Please remember that the weather changes daily. Please make sure that your child is dressed appropriately for all types of weather. We have a very limited amount of extra coats , hats, and gloves in the Health office. Kids will still go out doors for recess when temperatures feel like 10 degrees or above. Please send a coat to school everyday as morning recess is still very chilly.

Borrowed Clothes From the Health Office: Please remember when your student comes home with any clothing or items from the health office we ask you to please wash them and return them back to the health office so we are able to provide these items to other students that are in need of them in the future.

GRADE LEVEL SPOTLIGHT: 5TH GRADE

On March 2nd , fifth graders went on their field trip to Junior Achievement-Biztown. This is an intense and incredible experience! Students are required to prepare fortheir visit, every day, for months. In preparation, students learn a variety of 21 st Century skills. They learn all about being citizens of a community. They register to vote, learn about taxes, and public goods and services. Students build their financial literacy by learning how to deposit paychecks, write checks, use debit cards, and understand a variety of payment methods. Students also learn a variety of work readiness skills. They apply and interview for the job that they will have while they are at Biztown. They then work in business teams to generate a variety of advertisements to encourage citizens to use the goods and services provided by their business. On the day of their visit, students work for an entire day, operating their businesses independently. They also have breaks where they are required to go to the bank, manage their finances, and shop at neighboring businesses. Biztown is an incredibly rewarding experience and one of students most cherished 5 th grade memories!
