<u>When to Stay Home</u>

Fever- Student must be fever free for 24 hours (less than 101 degrees) without a fever reducer medication.

Vomit- Student must have not vomited for 24 hours before returning to school.

Diarrhea- Student must be free from diarrhea for 24 hours.

Pink Eye- Student can return to school after 1st dose of medication or as directed by your physician.

Lice- Student is not sent home the day of discovery. Allowed to return after initial treatment.

Restrictions- Any school related or PE related restrictions needs a doctor's note to allow the student to sit out of any physical activity.

Medication- All medications that are to be administered in the health office needs to be in the original container, needs to have the pharmacy label attached, and the medication authorization signed. Medications will not be administered without these.

Stock Medications- There are NO stock medications in the elementary health office. If you would like your student to have Tylenol or Ibuprofen, you will need to send the medication to school, in the original container, with the Medication Authorization form.

Art: Mrs. Scharper

I am ecstatic to be teaching art in the Urbandale School district, and it has been an absolute pleasure to have met each and every one of your children the last few days. The first days of school, your children have learned all about how the art room functions and what it means to be artists. We also read my favorite first day of art book called, "The Beautiful Oops" by Barney Saltzberg. This book walks through the many challenges we face as artists when we make mistakes, and how to change our "accidents" into something beautiful. If your child has not already told you about it, I encourage you to ask them about this book! In the weeks to come, we will be diving into our first projects in the art room. Kindergarten will be exploring all different kinds of lines and they will also be working on cutting and glueing. The first graders will begin to learn about the famous Vincent Van Gogh and will be creating textured sun flower paintings. Second graders are going to be reviewing lines and begin a new technique in the art room called printmaking, and they will also be introduced to another famous artist named Andy Warhol. Third graders will begin talking about abstract art while combining line, shapes, and colors to create pictures using oil pastels and taking cues from Russian abstract artist, Wassily Kandinsky. Finally, fifth graders will begin a project about Wavne Theibaud and create some tasty treats while learning how to blend chalk pastels to show value. I highly encourage you to ask about our art projects at home, and to take interest into the awesome artists your children are learning about in the art room. I look forward to creating art with your children in the months ahead, and I count it as a privilege to create with them every day.
