



Course Title: World Languages Level 2

Description:

German II- Urbandale Community School District's World Language German II course emphasizes continued vocabulary acquisition and development of language structures through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students will continue to explore German-speaking cultures.

Japanese II- Urbandale Community School District's World Language Japanese II course emphasizes continued vocabulary acquisition, development of language structures and writing systems through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students will continue to explore Japanese culture.

Spanish II- Urbandale Community School District's World Language Spanish II course emphasizes continued vocabulary acquisition and development of language structures through speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Students will continue to explore Spanish-speaking cultures.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of both semesters of Level I with a passing grade
